STEM

- Describe how water is used in everyday life.
- Describe the advantages and disadvantages of using renewable energy sources.
- Look at various images of waterwheels and windmills and explain how they are similar and/or different.

Students in 4/5/6 have engaged in an IT based research task which has involved them finding information about a famous key figure or event in Australia's history. They will communicate their ideas and will explain the significance in the development of Australian democracy in the form of a PowerPoint presentation.
